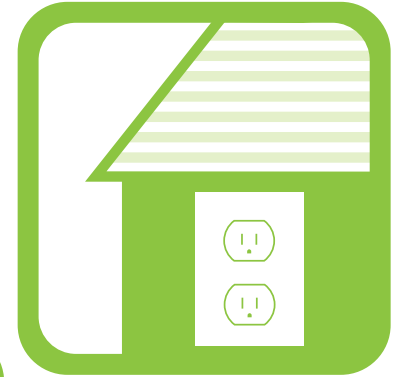


# VETERANS

Technician: Maintenance and Repair, Electrician, Boilermaker, Electronics Technician, Solar Thermal Installer, Wind Turbine Technician	Install, maintain, and repair machines and equipment in power plants, substations and buildings.	High School Diploma and On-the-Job Training, Associate Degree, Military Training <b>\$28,000 - \$71,000</b>
